Introduction

Christine Phal, founder of the Drawing Now Art Fair and the Drawing Lab



We are pleased to welcome Karine Rougier to the Drawing Lab. She is our 11th Drawing Now Prize winner. This annual award is always presented at the Drawing Now Art Fair in Paris, and shines a light on the unique artistic practice of a midcareer artist. It also acknowledges the work of the winner's art gallery who often started to work with the artist from her or his beginnings. This time, we offer recognition to Bertrand Baraudou's art gallery Espace à vendre, located in Nice. Espace à vendre has been representing Karine Rougier since 2005.

This year, we have increased our commitment to the Prize winner with a particularly long exhibition and double the usual production budget. This includes an exhibition catalog and many related public events. Karine Rougier's exhibition can be visited from 20 January to 31 March 2023. It will also feature in the Drawing Now Art Fair in the Carreau du Temple, from 23 to 26 March 2023. Moreover, Prize winners always get 10,000 EUR for their solo exhibitions in addition to the

5,000 EUR prize money, and their exhibition catalog is published and distributed by Le Livre d'art - La Manufacture de l'image.

The Drawing Lab teams welcome exhibition visitors 7 days a week from 11am to 7pm, and offer artistic mediation Wednesdays to Saturdays. They also offer art workshops for children and guided tours for all audiences, from private individuals to schools.

I am very proud to produce Karine Rougier biggest solo exhibition in Paris: "Nous qui désirons sans fin". Her unique artistic universe will no doubt captivate you as much as me every time I see one of her new works of art.

The Exhibition

Karine Rougier, the 2022 Drawing Now Prize winner, offers a unique group experience in her 2023 solo exhibition at the Drawing Lab: "We Who Desire Forever". From drawings realized with graphite or gouache to paintings, via watercolors, and from films to slideshows, her exhibition offers more than one story. This exhibition is a collection of stories by Karine Rougier and her special guests.

Her new drawings reimagine Nature with a combination of human and animal forms. Physical bodies and hidden powers come together in a unique and mesmerizing embrace. Filled with vibrant vital energy, Karine Rougier's compositions stem from a liberated gaze which imbues each figure with passion and power.

Karine Rougier's miniatures were originally inspired by the illuminations of *Clavis Artis* alchemical manuscript from the late 17th or early 18th century. But they resonate deeply with the

urgency of today's climate challenge, by touching upon the power of nature, and the relationships

between living creatures and the elements. "We are the children of a devastated world, trying to be reborn in a world waiting to be created. Learning to become human is the only radical thing to do." (Raoul Vaneigeim)

At the Drawing Lab, Karine Rougier explores her artistic world in new ways. Playing with scale and techniques, she blurs the boundaries between reality and fiction. Her drawings teem with details and include icons and characteristics from civilizations around the world. These shapes are initially hinted at through graphite on paper and then brought further into reality through colorful gouache and acrylic paints. Drawing has always been a core part of her art. And its wealth of detail has viewers move closer to explore her art's many meanings.

In this free-flowing exhibition where water and body fluids create a bond, Karine Rougier revisits and revives those antique images, as if protecting herself from today's terrifying reality. She opens up our hearts to magic and tenderness, while giving a voice to imaginary monsters and other worlds. All this as she explores the universal nature of hugging, breastfeeding, and the physical intermingling of bodies as sources of love and subjective or collective energy.

Drawings rise from the paper and come to life in two short films Karine Rougier made with Valérie Pelet. Created at the Centre de Conservation et de Ressources (CCR) in the MuCEM² in Marseilles thanks to

a Mécènes du Sud production grant, their short films feature both playing and divination cards. These cards span several centuries and have been carefully cataloged by and stored in Marseilles' CCR. The duo's films compare the aesthetics of the gestures involved in archiving cards versus playing cards, both vainly seeking to reduce the role of chance. Whether on land or in water, the drawings in Karine Rougier and Valérie Pelet's films play with the cards' various details, up to and including the stars and the gods.

Karine Rougier has also extended two invitations. First and foremost, Karine Rougier invited Stephen Ellcock who is a collector of images, researcher, and author, notably of books from which the artist often sourced images. Stephen Ellcock has picked images that echo Karine Rougier's work, thus inverting the regular sequence of events in her artistic process. Since they share common interests in cosmology, illuminated manuscripts, alchemy, magical texts, and all forms of esotericism

more generally, a fruitful dialogue occurred like a "cosmic dance"³.

And since she teaches at the Beaux-Arts de Marseille art school, Karine Rougier also asked students to "narrate in miniature for" using playing cards and divinatory cards. Their artistic responses take the form of drawn and photographed slides which, in the exhibition, are shown in projected images.

Nous qui désirons sans fin is an expedition into the vast world of drawing. It is an invitation to pick and play a card, an invitation to behold a new world.

Karine Rougier was born in 1982 in Malta, she lives and works in Marseille.

Valérie Pelet was born in 1981 in Austria, she lives and works in Marseille.

Stephen Ellcock lives and works in London.

Exquisite Corpse: Karine Rougier's exhibition is directly inspired by the tarot and divinatory cards, but also by icons and attributes from all the world's civilizations. Thus, every detail of the exhibition "Nous qui désirons sans fin" comes from this universe so dear to the artist. Now it's your turn to create your own playing cards using the exquisite corpse technique. Get out your pencils, free your imagination and let yourself be carried away in the creation of your cards... It's up to you!

Mysterious good point: In schools, vouchers were often made in the form of a small coupon which pupils kept carefully. Ten vouchers could be exchanged for a picture. The Drawing Lab offers you your vouchers after your visit to Karine Rougier's exhibition and invites you to create your own image. Take your scissors, glue, coloured pencils and markers to create your own bon point.

About the Artist

Born in 1982, lives and works in Marseille. Represented by Espace à vendre gallery in Nice since 2005.

Karine Rougier's drawings reimagine nature, with both human and animal shapes mixing and merging. Bodies and invisible powers unite in a single, spellbinding embrace. Watercolor washes over these shapes on paper and, like the receding tide, leaves only some details. A handful of lines stay and catch the eye.

Replete with life, her compositions stem from a liberated gaze that induces passion and strength in the shapes. Karine Rougier began her studies at the Swiss decorative arts school Les Arts Décoratifs de Genève and continued at the French art school École supérieure d'art d'Aix-en-Provence. She has been teaching at the Beaux-Arts de Marseille art school in France since 2018. Karine Rougier represented Malta at the Venice Biennale in 2017.

The Drawing Now Prize



Since 2011, the Drawing Now Prize has been supporting a drawing artist and honouring the work of his/her gallery. The Drawing Now Prize is supported by the main sponsor SOFERIM. The aim is to encourage the work of a draughtman in the middle of his or her career, wich is a complex time for creation.

For this 11th Drawing Now Prize, the method is evolving in order to give greater scope and visibility to the winning artist's practice and to

establish this award as a creation grant where the Drawing sphere - in particular Drawing Now Art Fair and the Drawing Lab - joins forces to offer: €5,000 in endowment, €10,000 in production aid, a three-month exhibition at the Drawing Lab and the publication of a monograph catalogue.

The Drawing Lab



Founded by Christine Phal in 2017 on a philanthropic model, the Drawing Lab is a private exhibition and experimental space entirely dedicated to the promotion of contemporary drawing. By presenting 3 exhibitions per year, it aims above all to be a place for the dissemination of drawing in all its forms, giving artists the opportunity to take drawing off the page and explore all its facets. In addition to producing exhibitions, the Drawing Lab is responsible for communication,

dissemination, welcoming the public, cultural mediation, publishing a catalogue and organising satellite events during the exhibition.

Located on level -1 of the Drawing Hotel, the Drawing Lab is open every day for free. The purpose of the space is to ensure the dissemination of contemporary drawing to all audiences

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The exhibition partners



Since 30 years, the property developer SOFERIM has been including art in its real estate operations. By choosing to be involved with the Drawing Society and the

Drawing Now Art Fair since its very first edition, Soferim has affirmed its desire to promote access to contemporary art through drawing and to bring art to the city.

The Drawing Society is the ecosystem founded by Christine Phal and Carine Tissot, **DRAWING** SOCIETY which is made up of two parts: the hotel part with the Drawing Hotels Collection (Drawing Hotel and Drawing House) and the artistic part with the contemporary drawing fair Drawing Now Art Fair, the Drawing Lab, a space for drawing experiments and exhibitions, and the cultural engineering company Drawing on Demand.

The Drawing Hotel is the Drawing Society's four-star boutique hotel located at 17 DRAWING HOTEL rue de Richelieu (Paris 1er). Carine Tissot, in collaboration with the architectural firm Nido, invited the artists Lek & Sowat, Abdelkader Benchamma, Clément Bagot, Françoise Pétrovitch, Thomas Broomé and Stéfane Perraud to occupy the rooms, corridors and common areas. Its rooftop, patio and exhibitions make it an artistic destination just a stone's throw from the Louvre.

espace Determined to pursue its vocation of supporting the local, national and à vendre international emerging art scene, Espace à vendre, founded and directed by Bertrand Baraudou, continues to mix the work of artists supported since 2004 with that of guest artists. Today, the gallery on rue Assalit has a unique location with 4 spaces: an exhibition room with a street frontage, a showroom, an adjoining courtyard creating a link with a new space of 130m² for a total surface area of 250 m².

The Mécènes du Sud network was created in 2003 to stimulate contemporary artistic creation. Every year, it co-produces works, projects and events in the Aix-Marseille and Montpellier-Sète-Béziers regions. The network accompanies the artists and helps them financially. The video at the CCR du Mucem by Karine Rougier and Valérie Pelet was produced thanks to its support.
